Adult Recreation Schedule at Junior High Announced

The following schedule for adult recreation will go into effect next Tuesday Jan. 2 at Roseburg Junior high school: Tuesday, Jan. 2, 7:30-9:30, leather tooling class; both men and women; Tuesday, Jan. 2, 7:30-9:30, adult badminton (Melrose and Garden Valley group); Wednesday, Jan. 3, 5:15-6:30, Business men's volleyball; Wednesday, Jan. 3, 7:30-9:30, adult badminton; Monday, Jan. 8, 7:30-9:30, Women's volleyball.

This recreation program is aided by federal funds to provide recreational activities for Roseburg citizens and the influx of population in the local lumber industry. A committee consisting of Percy Croft, chairman; Earl Wiley, Glen Wimberly, A. S. Coen and Kenneth Ford, was appointed by the mayor to authorize the distribution of the funds. Mrs. Eugene Peterson will act as recreation director with faculty members and other skilled persons acting as supervisors for the various activities. At the present time most of the program consists of gym work, but as soon as space is available other activities will be scheduled.

Of interest to a number of people will be the leather tooling class which will meet on Tuesday evening, Mrs. Peterson states. In this class they will have the opportunity to make and tool articles such as billfolds, key cases, coin purses or anything the individual wishes to make.

Materials and equipment are furnished for all scheduled activities, however, there may be a small fee for some but on the whole federal funds cover the major cost of operation. The public is urged to attend any or all activities, also to suggest any activities in which a group would be interested. Wheat Production Of Oregon in 1944 Under 1927 Record

CORVALLIS, Ore., Dec. 29.—(AP)—Oregon's wheat production from 1889 to the present varied from a low of 120,000 acres the first year to a 1927 high of 1,102,000 acres. Oregon State college extension service reported.

The 1889 crop was 2,340,000 bushels and the 1927 record crop, 27,540,000 bushels.

A smaller crop in 1920—21,795,000 bushels—was the most valuable, bringing a cash farm income of \$36,658,000. The lowest average price over a five-year period was 59 cents a bushel from 1930-34. This returned an average income of only \$8,264,000. The highest average price was \$1.62 a bushel from 1915-10.

Oregon's total acreage was reduced markedly from 1939 through 1943, when only 728,000 acres were grown. War demand increased the 1944 acreage to 929,000 and an estimated production only three million acres under the 1927 high.

Although about 90 per cent of the 1943 acreage was in eastern Oregon, all but two Oregon counties grow wheat. Umatilla county is the leading producer, followed by Sherman, Gilliam and Morrow.

SEATTLE, Dec. 29.—(AP)—The OPA today announced that buyers who purchase sweet clover seed for the account of other commercial distributors may charge an assembling service markup of 65 cents a hundred-weight, and buyers who purchase threshers-run sweet clover seed for their own account, may add a 75-cent markup on their sales.

These actions, effective as of last Tuesday, represent an increase of 30 and 35 cents, respectively, in markups and restore the full markup these sellers obtained before revision or regulations. They do not affect the price paid by the ultimate consumer; increases being absorbed out of the existing markup provided for commercial distributors.

The revised regulation had changed the basis of sales from gross to net weight without making allowance for the 30 per cent average dockage in sweet clover seed.
