Shortage of Tin Serious; Douglas Salvage Quota Set

In a measure designed to effect necessary increases in the salvage, collection and shipment of tin cans for the war effort, and to make people of this state conscious of the appalling number of tin cans which still are going into garbage dumps instead of into proper war channels, the state salvage committee, this week announced that monthly "tin can quotas" have been established for Oregon counties during the first quarter of 1945.

Douglas county's monthly quota has been set at 5 tons. "Tin can collections in this state slumped sharply during the last six months of 1944," according to Claude I. Sersanous, chairman of the state committee, who asserted that an immediate and intensive "step-up" in collections is vitally necessary if sufficient quantities of this critical metal are to be made available to war production sources.

"America's shortage of tin is a real, not an imaginative condition," Sersanous said, "and it is imperative that the general public recognize the seriousness of this shortage."

While quotas established for Oregon counties are still ridiculously low as compared to the 'potential' available in respective areas (no quota averages more than two tin cans per person per month) the state committee has attempted, in all cases, to take into consideration distances and transportation problems involved in collections and shipments.

The state chairman called upon all Oregon citizens to recognize the seriousness of the current slump in the salvage of tin cans and particularly urged that volunteer salvage committees bend every effort toward providing adequate collection facilities for this much-needed material.

"If sufficient necessary effort is mustered to meet these established quotas," Oregon's tin can shipments can be expected to jump from the current rate of 90 tons per month to better than 220 tons per month," Sersanous concluded.
