

Bill Demands Tenth Of State Highway Fund

help such cities as Hermiston, whose population has increased because of war activities, to obtain fair shares of state apportionments, which are made on a population basis.

Such a census would be paid for by the city.

The house elections committee introduced the first bill to prevent wholesale registration of war workers. The measure would prohibit election registrars from conducting campaigns to persuade persons to register.

First of a series of labor-sponsored bills to amend the workmen's compensation law was introduced by Rep. Manley J. Wilson, St. Helens. It would make it easier for a workman suffering from hernia as a result of work to prove his case.

The house expected to quit today for the week, while the senate will stay until Friday noon. Several senators wanted to quit today, asserting there isn't enough work to justify staying until Friday, but the majority of the senators felt that to quit today would cause the public to feel the lawmakers weren't earning their \$8 a day.

Political Scrap Looms

Groundwork for an all-out scrap between the 75 republican and the 15 democratic senators is being laid in the Portland republican legislature said they would introduce bills to prevent fraudulent voting in Multnomah county.

Asserting that thousands of democratic newcomers in Portland voted illegally last November, they said they would introduce measures providing for appointment of a civil service registrar of elections for the county, provide closer check of voters' registrations, and add additional judges to election boards.

They said many war workers voted democratic without having lived in the county the six months required.

The State Federation of Labor announced it would ask that unemployment compensation benefits be increased to \$25 a week for 26 weeks, compared with the current rate of \$15 a week for 16 weeks.

Ralph Moody Hired

The senate voted to hire Ralph E. Moody, Salem attorney, as its legal adviser at \$1500 for the session. The senators explained that Attorney General Neuner is too swamped with work, but Neuner will continue to assist the house members. Moody is a former assistant state attorney general, has been house legal adviser the past two sessions, and was the governor's special attorney in 1938 to prosecute labor terrorists.

The first bill was passed yesterday, it being a \$100,000 appropriation for expenses of the legislature.

Gile On Interstate Board

Five house members were appointed today by Speaker Eugene E. Marsh to the interstate cooperation committee. Five members each will be appointed by Governor Snell and president of the senate Howard C. Belton.

The house members are W. W. Chadwick, Salem, Chairman; Carl Francis, Dayton; Alex. Barry, Portland; Robert C. Gile, Roseburg; and R. C. Frisbie, Baker.

Preparing Fish Bill

A bill placing the state fish commission on an appropriation basis is being prepared and probably will be ready for introduction in the senate within a week or ten days, Senator Chessman, Astoria, announced Wednesday.

The commission is now operating on revenues received from poundage fees and licenses. Under the proposed new legislation placing the commission's operations on an appropriation basis all licenses and poundage fees received by the commission would go into the general fund of the state.

which has been holding down large forces of Americans, and captured Harlange at its center, six miles southeast of Bastogne. To the west the Third army won commanding ground in the St. Hubert area.

Lt. Gen. Patton's doughboys also captured Villers-La-Bonneau, two miles west of Harlange, while another infantry column making a parallel push near the narrow mouth of the sector drove to within 11 miles of the German stronghold of Wiltz in Luxembourg.

On the southern sector of the western front the U. S. Seventh army, which had spread its strength over part of the Saar front before the Third army moved units northward to the Ardennes bulge, gained a mile in an attack southwest of Saarbrücken, breaking into Oeting, just outside Forbach, five miles southwest of Saarbrücken.

North of Strasbourg along the Rhine other troops of Lt. Gen. Patch fought back into Drusenheim and Herrlisheim, both of which had been overrun by the Germans last week when they established a Rhine bridgehead. German attacks were repulsed in the Alsace plain between Strasbourg and Colmar.

tive while they were in the process of moving in and out, he added.

"The effective size of an army must be kept up to its ceiling," Stimson said. Adding that "it should be obvious that the tempo of war" has increased, Stimson said the Germans are not going to accept the inevitable end "without a fight to the finish." He said, too, that the war with Japan is running ahead of schedule.

"If the needs of the armies at the fronts are to be met," Stimson said, "there seems to be no escape from calling into the armed services during this year, substantially all physically qualified men below 30 years of age from factory, farm and government. But when we do this the places of these young men will have to be taken by older men, women and younger men not acceptable for military service."
