The newly formed veterans agricultural advisory committee, headed by Eugene H. Fisher, Oakland, reported on preliminary surveys of agricultural opportunity in the county and told of the program made to have accurate information ready for veterans interested in farming here. The agricultural industry of the county in general is facing a year of practically full production again, at prices still in favor, though possibly with some reductions compared with last year, according to a summary by County Agent J. Roland Parker.

Trends in recent years have been for farmers to receive a greater portion of their income from livestock and livestock products than from crop products. Farm marketings show approximately 68 per cent of the agricultural income of the county is from dairying, meat animals, poultry and miscellaneous animal products, while cash crops account for about 32 per cent against 55 per cent from animal products and 45 per cent from crops for the period of 1926-30.

D. N. Busenbark, Roseburg, chairman of the county agricultural planning committee, presided over the meeting and reviewed the purposes and activities of the various subcommittees.
