Short Spud Supply Starts to Show

Since production of late potatoes in 1944 was a bit short of maximum requirements, potato supplies are becoming pinched in some areas, particularly in the west where the army is taking about half of the offerings in heavy producing areas in Idaho, Oregon and California. The bulk of the remaining 1944 potatoes are in the eastern states. Efforts are now centered on the normal marketing of the remaining supply so that it will be properly distributed. All relief distribution of potatoes by the government has been discontinued and all potatoes purchased by the government in liquidating loans will be resold to the trade to be turned into civilian consumption channels.

Potato growers have a record supply of certified seed for 1945 planting since nearly one out of every 12 bushels of 1944 potatoes produced in the U. S. was certified for seed, compared with an average of only one out of 25 bushels during 1933-42. The largest acreage ever harvested produced 32,339,991 bushels of certified seed in 1944—11 per cent above the 1943 record. However, production of war approved seed potatoes, estimated at 4,570,290 bushels, is only 36 per cent of 1943 production.
