PRICE CONTROL: Refer inquiries and complaints to nearest Federal Reserve Bank.

PROCESSED FOODS: BOOK 4—Blue stamps X3 through 25, and A2B2, valid indefinitely. Blue stamps C2 through G-2 valid Monday, January 1.

MEAT BUTTER, CHEESE: BOOK 4—Red stamps G3 through S3 valid indefinitely. Red stamps S3 through X3 valid on Sunday, December 31.

STAPLES: BOOK 4: Sugar stamp 34 valid indefinitely. 5 pounds.

BOOKS: Lease Stamps Invalid. BOOK 3: Airplane stamps 1-2-3 valid indefinitely.

GASOLINE COUPONS: Not valid unless endorsed. 'A' 14 expires March 21, 1945. Each coupon worth 4 gallons.

STOVES: Apply local board for oil, gas stove certificates.

WOOD, COAL, SAWDUST: Delivery by priorities based on needs.

FUEL OIL: Period 4 and 5 coupons (1943-44 series) and period 1 and 2 coupons (1944-45 series) valid through August 31, 1945. Not more than 22 1/2 of season's rations should have been used to date.
