MEAT, BUTTER, FATS, CHEESE. Book 4—Red stamps Q5 through Z5 and A5 through G5 new valid.

SUGAR: Book 1. Sugar stamp 34 valid for 3 pounds. New sugar stamp 35 is valid February 1 for 3 pounds.

SHOES: LOOSE STAMPS INVALID. Book 2—Argonne stamps 1-3 valid indefinitely. COUPONS: NOT VALID UNLESS ENDORSED.

"A" 11 expires March 21, each coupon worth 4 gallons.
