Battle for Berlin Enters Final Stage
(Continued from Page 1)

along 185 miles of the river from Latibor in Silesia to Gruenberg, 50 miles southeast of Frankfurt.

The Moscow radio said Heinrich Himmler had massed SS troops in the capital. Roads south and west of Berlin were reported jammed with the traffic of refugees in flight.

Gauleiter Paul Joseph Goebbels, originally entrusted with the city's defense, had fled to southern Germany, Moscow declared. The German yesterday denied that Goebbels had left.

Key Cities Pierced

Moscow dispatches said Kustrin, 40 miles east of Berlin and one of the chief fortified areas guarding the capital, was about to fall, with soviet tommygunners fighting in the streets under cover from artillery batteries stationed only two miles from the northern outskirts.

Reports later than the Russian communique said the Russians had gone on and fought on into the suburbs of Frankfurt—perhaps the suburb of Dammvorst, just across the river from Frankfurt and connected with the main city by a 900-foot bridge.

Obviously, Zhukov was broadening the base of his east bank wedge for an all-out operation against Berlin. He appeared to have almost complete control of the east bank from Fuerstenberg, 47 miles southeast of Berlin, to Zaokerik—a stretch of more than

toward Stettin and the Baltic, had sent spearheads into Pyritz, 24 miles southeast of Stettin, and Arnswalde, 35 miles southeast of Stettin. The German communique said there were house-to-house battles in these two places.

Reds Gain in Silesia

In Silesia, the Germans reported further soviet progress from the soviet bridgehead northwest of Breslau at Steinau—which the Russians have not yet claimed although the Germans have announced its abandonment—and at Glogau, 54 miles northwest of Breslau.

South and southeast of Breslau, the Russians announced the capture of more than 50 towns in their drive toward the Sudetenland and Dresden—across the communication lines which the Germans would need for a withdrawal into their Bavarian and Moravian mountain fortress if their stand in Berlin fails.

In the fight for the encircled fortress city of Poznan, where a suicide force of 20,000 Germans has been left, the German high command disclosed that the garrison had been driven into the northern remnants of the Polish city.

East Prussia Holds Out

In East Prussia, the Russians captured 30 more places and announced the capture of 2,200 more German officers and men, but the Germans said some ad-
