Reds Gain in Silesia In Silesia, the Germans report-ed further soviet progress from the soviet bridgehead northwest of Breslau at Steinau-which the Russians have not yet claimed although the Germans have an-nounced its abandonment—and at Glogau, 54 miles northwest of Breslau. South and southeast of Breslau, the Russians announced the cap-ture of more than 50 towns in their drive toward the Sudeten-land and Dresden-across the communication lines which the Germans would need for a withdrawal into their Bavarian and Morvaian mountain fortress if their stand in Berlin fails.


