Sgt. M. Northcraft Wins Air Medal

15TH AAF IN ITALY—Technical Sergeant Millard C. Northcraft, Brockway, Ore., has recently been awarded the air medal for "Meritorious achievement while participating in aerial flight."

He is an aerial engineer in a 15th air force Flying Fortress squadron operating from an advanced base in Italy. He has taken part in 12 aerial attacks on enemy installations in Germany, Austria and the Balkan countries.

Sgt. Northcraft entered the AAF in Jan. 1942. He received his gunner's wings at Tyndall field, Fla., in October, 1944. He has now been overseas three months.

His father, W. H. Northcraft, lives at Brockway.
