Commodities Under Loans Not Desired

Since there appears to be a mistaken idea in some quarters regarding the Commodity Credit Corporation loan policy, AAA committeemen have been asked to advise producers that CCC payers not to take title to commodities under loan. Leo Sparks, chairman of the County AAA committee reports.

It is the policy of CCC to encourage producers to redeem their loans on any commodity whenever they can realize a return equal to or in excess of the loan plus carrying charges, or in the case of wheat when the return will equal or exceed the net amount from the parity purchase price offered for wheat remaining under loan on May 1, 1945.

Mr. Sparks said. The parity purchase price on wheat is the loan value plus 15 cents a bushel, less all carrying charges to the end of the storage year.

R. H. S. Indians to Battle Uni-Hi Five In Season Finale

The Roseburg High school Indians will meet University High school of Eugene tonight in the last basketball game of the season for the home team. The game will be played on the Senior High school court, starting at 8:15 o'clock.

Tuesday's games at Roseburg and Eugene probably will determine whether Rendall Young, high-scoring forward for the Indians, or Darrell Robinson, Eugene High, will take high point honors for the season. The Eugene Axemen will be playing Cottage Grove tonight while the Indians are meeting Uni-Hi.

Young has replaced Robinson in first place with 59 points. Robinson is a close second with 52, and Heath, Cottage Grove, is in third spot with 32. Thirteen players in the league are credited with 50 or more points for the season. James, Roseburg guard, being one of the players in the division with 52 points.

Young has a one-game edge over Robinson 9 to 8. He has shot 41 field goals to Robinson's 38, but Robinson has converted 20 free throws while Young has tossed 17. Robinson has been credited with 21 personal fouls and Young with 15.

The Eugene Axemen, who have won the league championship, are scheduled for a three-game playoff with Myrtle Point, district No. 5 winners. The first game will be played in Eugene March 2. The second will be played at Myrtle Point March 6, and if a third game is required it will be played March 9 on a neutral floor. The winner will go to the state championship tournament.

Technical Sergeant Worth Wells, son of Mrs. E. E. Wells, Roseburg, has been awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross, oak leaf cluster to his Air Medal, and presidential unit citation, according to word received by his mother.

Sergeant Wells is completing 10 months of flying with the ATC on the difficult India-China route, over the Himalaya mountains. He is serving as aerial engineer.

The citation accompanying the award of the oak leaf cluster reads as follows: "Flying at night as well as by day, at high altitudes over impassable, mountainous terrain through areas characterized by extremely treacherous weather conditions, necessitating long periods of operation on instruments and superior performance of his duties." He accomplished his mission with distinction.

Sergeant Wells was graduated from Roseburg High school with the class of 1941. He was employed with the Payton Fuel company at Klamath Falls when he entered military service March 9, 1942.

NATIONAL PEST TURNS INTO ANZAC WARTIME BENEFIT CANBERRA (AP)—War has glorified Australia's national pest—the rabbit.

Early settlers brought rabbits from England. Australia spent millions of dollars trying to get rid of them. They have been hunted with guns, traps, poison bait, ferrets and gas. A transcontinental, supposedly rabbit-proof fence was built from north to south in western Australia years ago. But still the rabbit increased.

Today Australia is almost reconciled to the pest. The animals are entirely free of disease. Rabbit meat is coupon free and even the more select restaurants are now serving rabbit. Export of pets to the United States is increasing.
