Legislative By-Product. The battle in the House over what to do about the George bill (the bill to take the RFC and other lending agencies from the control of the Secretary of Commerce) had an interesting result in another direction this week. Two bills which probably would not have reached consideration for months suddenly came up Wednesday and were passed. One is known as the insurance bill, which gives companies a period of time before being placed definitely under the anti-trust laws. The other was the Hobbs bill to review railroad bankruptcy settlements for the purpose of considering the interests of small stockholders. Action on these bills was directly a by-product of the battle by our side of the House (Rep.) to keep the George bill from coming to the floor.

Under a procedure known as "Calendar Wednesday," which has been dispensed with for some years, any regular committee may call up a bill for action on the floor. The majority leader decided to use this means of bringing the George bill out. But he overlooked the fact that the Calendar Wednesday rule also requires that committees be called in a certain order. The Committee on Judiciary, controlled by anti-Wallace Democrats, came ahead of the Banking and Currency committee on the list as it is called. When the clerk reached Judiciary on the list, the chairman of that committee took the floor and called up the insurance bill. After it was acted upon, he then called up the Hobbs bill. This consumed the remainder of the afternoon. Thus the George bill did not come up for consideration on Wednesday.

The anti-Wallace members of the Rules committee finally weakened, however, so next day the George bill came onto the floor with a regular rule.

Loans for Veterans. Under the loan provisions of the GI bill passed by the last Congress, a total of nearly 6400 applications of veterans have been filed for eligibility for government guaranty. More than 1200 of these have actually been filed loan applications which have been or are being processed. Of this total, two applications were for business loans, two for farm loans and the entire balance were for home loans. Fourteen per cent of all the applications were rejected as not meeting the requirements of a sound loan.

As veterans return, increasing numbers will be taking advantage of the loan provisions of veterans' legislation. Veterans must first file an application for a certificate to establish their eligibility for the loan. When eligibility is established the loan application may be filed. The Veterans administration guarantees up to 50 per cent of any loan, but not to exceed a total loan guaranty of \$2,000. The loan guaranty may be divided up on several different loans if the veteran so desires. All lending is done by individuals or private agencies, who may

desire to extend credit to the veteran. If there are any veterans of the present war who desire information, I shall be glad to send them a pamphlet giving questions and answers.

Applications for pensions by veterans' dependents are practically swamping the Veterans administration at this time. They are receiving from dependents of World War II veterans approximately 1,000 applications a week, and under the law passed late last year making all World War I unremarried widows eligible for a pension, an average of 2500 applications a day are reaching the Veterans administration.

Useful Bulletins. Those who are planning spring planting of farm crops, home gardens or flowers may be interested to know that there are available without cost numerous bulletins on subjects concerning the home and farm. Annually, each member of Congress is assigned a limited allotment of bulletins which are distributed to constituents on request. A complete bulletin list will be mailed to anyone writing me a card at 1631 House Office Building, Washington, D. C.

Two bulletins which may be of interest to most farmers are "Farm Bookkeeping and the Federal Income Tax," and "Useful Records for Family Farms." There is also a good selection of bulletins on farm buildings, construction and maintenance.

Jack Horn Wins Fresh Laurels in Debating Contests

Jack Horn, son of Mr. and Mrs. Harold Horn, Roseburg, has been making an outstanding record as a member of the debate team of Bowling Green State university, Ohio, where he is a student in the navy's V-12 program, according to reports received by his parents. Teamed with Cornot Allen, former national president of the Young Republicans club, Horn has participated in debates against Notre Dame, Pennsylvania, Pittsburgh, Washington and Jefferson, Mt. Perry college and numerous other schools. He and Allen have won all of their debates, but the Bowling Green negative team has lost two contests.

Horn was graduated from Roseburg High school with the class of 1944 and entered naval training July 1. While attending high school, he participated for two years in debate work, was a member of the state championship team, and a winner of the state declamation contest.

In a contest of different character, Horn recently furnished proof that his ability is not all mental, as he won second place in a strength test given all V-12 candidates.

On what and how much to produce. One Federal agency says there are too many eggs, so we must cut down 20%. Another says we will need more eggs than last year. 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VACCINATE TURKEYS FOR POX.

Pox at marketing time is pretty bad business. But you can vaccinate when you take them from the brooder houses, and they will hardly know anything happened. It doesn't cost much in cash or time, and pox is getting so prevalent in Douglas County that it won't pay to take a chance. Make your plans now for vaccinating next summer.

Plan to Substitute for Canvas, Ranchers Advised
Since the supply and demand situation on canvas is far from encouraging at this time, farmers and ranchers who are accustomed to utilizing canvas in connection with their operations would do well to explore the possibility of substituting any other materials that may be available. Total production of canvas is not currently sufficient to meet military requirements which means

that substitutions must be made in other important uses of this material.

Growers' Notice Called To Packaging Outlook
Shippers and growers of fresh fruits and vegetables are advised by the War Food Administration to again be prepared to take special measures to assure themselves of adequate container supplies. Wartime adjustments in packaging crops need to be continued such as ordering containers as far in advance as possible, taking delivery at any time containers are available, and salvaging containers and re-using them to the utmost.
