Salaries of Douglas county's elective officers will be temporarily increased when Governor Snell signs House Bill 264, which was passed Tuesday by the senate. The increases are authorized for a period of two years only. Salaries under the provisions of the bill will be as follows: County Judge \$3,000, county commissioners \$10 per day for each day in attendance, county treasurer \$2,400, county clerk \$3,000, sheriff \$3,000, assessor \$3,000, school superintendent \$2,700.
