Lieut. Currier of
Glide Wins Medal
For War Action

Marine First Lieutenant James R. Currier of Glade, Oregon, recently was awarded a Silver Star medal for conspicuous gallantry in action against the Japs on Peleliu, the marine corps announces.

He was cited by Lieutenant General Holland M. Smith, commanding general of the fleet marine force in the Pacific for directing fire against Jap positions from an exposed position, despite the fact all of his men were put out of action.

"Although he was not required to do so, First Lieutenant Currier led his forward control team to an exposed position well in advance of the attacking troops in order to gain observation," the citation reads.

"When every man in his control team had been killed or wounded, First Lieutenant Currier, with utter disregard for his personal safety, remained alone at his post in the face of grave peril and directed devastating and effective fire on the enemy position, inflicting heavy casualties and permitting the battalion to seize its objective," the citation said.

Lieutenant Currier also was credited with leading a group of headquarters personnel in cleaning snipers from a cave in a coral hill.

He is a 1942 graduate of the University of Washington. His parents, Mr. and Mrs. Ralph L. Currier, live at Glade, Oregon.
