Elderly Resident of Camas Valley Missing

Sheriff O. T. Carter was called to Camas Valley today by a report that Charles Henderson, 76, who resides about seven miles west of Camas Valley, had been missing from his home since 1:30 p. m. J. A. Macdonald, Physical Director At Facility, Dies

John Alexander Macdonald, veteran of World War I and recreation and physical director at the Roseburg veterans administration facility, died last night.

Born in Scotland he had been a resident of the United States since he was about two years old. He enlisted in the first World War, serving as first lieutenant in the air corps. Mr. Macdonald was an outstanding athlete and was a member of United States Olympic teams.

He was married to Ethel Collier in Indiana, August 5, 1925. He had been associated with Veterans administration since 1921 and came to the facility at Roseburg from Los Angeles in November, 1942.

Mr. Macdonald was a member of the American Legion, an active member of the Episcopal church and a member of the church choir.

He is survived by his widow, Mrs. Ethel Macdonald of Roseburg.

Funeral services will be conducted by Father William L. Blaker at St. George's Episcopal church Saturday afternoon at 2 o'clock. Military rites and commitment will follow in the Veterans cemetery. Arrangements are in charge of the Douglas Funeral home.

Frank Adamek, Farmer Of Brockway, Passes

Frank Adamek, 65, well-known resident of Brockway, died yesterday. He was born in Bohemia October 10, 1879, and had been a resident of Brockway, where he was engaged in farming, for the past 24 years. He was a veteran of the Spanish-American war, serving as a corporal with Company F, 11th regiment infantry.
