Pvt. Roy Dobell Killed While Prisoner of Japanese

Pvt. Roy Dobell, son of Mr. and Mrs. Roy H. Dobell, Salem, and a grandson of the late William M. Gordon, Camas lake, was among American prisoners of war who were killed September 7, when a Japanese freighter carrying more than 750 prisoners was sunk by an American submarine, according to word received by his parents. He was made a prisoner while serving at Clark field in the Philippines. Last August he was taken from Lusan and was placed aboard the ill-fated Japanese freighter, which, after 19 days at anchor in the gulf of Davao, set sail for Japan, only to be sunk by an American submarine. Only 83 prisoners are known to have survived.

"30 Seconds Over Tokyo" Film Dated At Indian Theatre

"Thirty Seconds Over Tokyo," being presented at the Indian theater beginning Wednesday, March 28, through Saturday, March 31, is a film of epic proportions. Vividly adapted from the screen by that expert dramatist, Dalton Trumbo, from the best-seller by Captain (now Major) Ted Lawson and Robert Considine, the film emerges as one of the most human stories to come out of the present war.

Climaxed by the famous Doolittle bombing of Tokyo, it relates the glorious personal romance of Ted and Ellen Lawson, the man who takes part in daring adventure and the woman who waits for his return. Their story is one of human beings during wartime.

Mervyn LeRoy has combined this romance with gripping suspense and thrilling characterizations by an expert cast. A star no less than Spencer Tracy was chosen to portray the celebrated leader of the historic raid and Lawson is portrayed by Van Johnson; Staff Sgt. Thatcher is played by Robert Walker and Ellen Lawson is portrayed by Phyllis Thaxter.

The story tells of the Doolittle mission over Tokyo in one of the most stirring tales of the times. This is one of the films chosen by the War Department and provided by the motion picture industry for showing overseas in combat areas, Red Cross hospitals and at isolated outposts.
