Deny Mental Test For Accused Youth

SEATTLE, April 10—(AP)—Superior Judge Arthur McGuire, visiting Ellensburg jurist, denied a motion by counsel today that Charles (Red) Thomas, 16, charged with second degree murder for the county jail torture death of John Emberg, be examined by a sanity commission.

Judge McGuire ruled that Thomas' additional plea, innocent by reason of mental irresponsibility, was entered after the jury had been impaneled and the question was before the jury. Thomas is on trial with two 15-year-old companions, Chester Mabe and Donald Beal.

Prosecutor Lloyd Shorette said he expected to wind up the state's case today, after further questioning of more youths in the juvenile tank when Emberg was fatally beaten with a metal shower handle January 16. The trial, attended by overflow crowds, goes into the third week tomorrow.

FEDERAL POWER COMMISSION, Washington, D. C. Public notice is hereby given, pursuant to the provisions of the Federal Power Act (16 U. S. C. 791-825), that The California Oregon Power Company, of Yreka, California, has made application for preliminary permit for proposed major Project No. 1927, on the North Umpqua River, in Douglas County, Oregon, consisting of a diversion dam at river elevation 2,375 about 500 feet downstream from the mouth of Clearwater River, creating a pool with normal elevation of 2,410 feet; a tunnel in rock about 7,000 feet long across a bend in the river; a double line of steel penstocks; and a power house at river elevation 1,955 with installation of 40,000 kilowatts in two units. Any protest against the approval of this application or request for hearing thereon, with the reasons for such protest or request and the name and address of the party or parties so protesting or requesting, should be submitted before May 8, 1945, to the Federal Power Commission, at Washington, D.
