Payroll Deduction In 7th War Loan Drive Discussed

The payroll deduction program connected with the 7th war loan drive was discussed at a dinner meeting at the Umpqua hotel Saturday. Approximately 40 employees and leading workers in the payroll division of the county war saving staff attended. The program was conducted by H. C. Berg, payroll division chairman.

A 45-minute transcribed radio program over the facilities of the Mutual Broadcasting system and Station KRNR was presented, the program including some of the most famous personalities of radio, stage and screen, government officials and heads of war bond departments. The program was not released to the general public but was for bond workers only.

The program also included a motion picture film furnished by the Treasury department and a short talk by John Hodgkins of the state war saving staff.

County's Record Praised Archie Eyles, county chairman for the 7th War Loan campaign, introduced Jack Harding as assistant chairman. Speaker Hodgkins particularly praised the record of Douglas county in past drives and reported that H. O. Partridge, chairman of the county war savings staff, is one of five county chairmen who have served continuously since the first bond campaign was launched.

All bonds sold through payroll deductions during April, May and June will be included in the 7th War Loan goal.

Kiser Wins Over Maloney; Achiu Conquers Ross

Jack Kiser, A-1 Pacific northwest wrestler in the light-heavyweight division and 4-F on the military manpower list by reason of a punctured eardrum, won a two-fall match with "Speedy" Maloney of Pittsburgh on the weekly card at the Roseburg armory Saturday night.
