## Proposed Alley Paving Considered by Council

A. N. Oresti advised, however, that before the council could entertain the petition, it would be necessary that a sewer district be established to be responsible for the collection and payment of service fees.

Councilman C. P. Snoddy voiced objection to the city granting either sewage connection or fire protection services to any territory not a part of the city. He declared that in his opinion the city should invite annexation of outside territory regardless of the fact that the tax base could not be increased in proportion to additional valuation. He urged extension of the city's boundaries to include all of the immediately adjacent residential districts.

### New Ordinance Ordered

Ben Zenor reported that he proposes to move the building, formerly occupied by The Spot Tavern, located on the lot adjoining the Northside apartments, to Second Avenue South. He was given permission to move the building after making arrangements with utility companies for the raising of power and telephone lines during the moving process. Attention was called to the fact that the city has no suitable ordinance covering the moving of buildings, and instructions were given that such an ordinance be prepared.

City Street Superintendent George Frew informed the council he had received a complaint from the Union Oil company claiming that agreement had been made by the Young's Bay Lumber company to take care of surface water turned upon the Oil company's property by construction of the lumber company's spur track, but that the agreement had not been fulfilled. The council contended that the city had not been made a part of the agreement and it was, therefore, a matter to be settled by the two companies.

### New Beer License Denied

An application for transfer of beer license for Walter's Place from the present location in the Hochadel building at Jackson and Washington streets to 630 N. Jackson street, directly opposite the Northside Apartment building, was received. At the same time, the council was presented with petitions bearing 111 signatures, remonstrating against the location, claiming it would be disturbing to the occupants of the apartments. The council refused to approve the license application.

Approval was given an application for beer license made by Kenneth Whitney and Donald Bowser, who recently purchased Sander's Place in the I. O. O. F. building.

The usual reports of officers and departments were read and monthly bills paid.

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to cease resistance. This immediately was flashed to the world and reached the Associated Press offices in Paris through normal channels.

On the basis of this fact Kennedy interviewed SHAEF censors and demanded immediate release of his Reims story.

He asserted that according to SHAEF's long established policy, military security was the only consideration on which correspondent's reports were censored. He said that in view of broadcast reports from Flensburg, London and Stockholm there was no military security involved, and he also openly notified the censors that he intended to file his story.

Kennedy said he considered the function of his staff and of himself was to report the news, and that he did not feel bound by any considerations of political censorship.

As he returned to the hotel where a majority of the correspondents both live and work numbers of them shook his hand and congratulated him on the stand he had taken and the tremendous heat he had scored — even though it had been at their expense.

SHAEF censorship subsequently permitted any and all correspondents to quote details from Kennedy's dispatch concerning what he saw and heard at Reims.

Japan Still Faced

He reminded Britain at the same time "we may allow ourselves a brief period of rejoicing, but let us not forget for a moment the toll and efforts that lie ahead."

"Japan, with all her treachery and greed," he declared, "remains unsubdued. The injury she has inflicted on the United States and other countries and her detestable cruelties call for justice and retribution."

"We must now devote all our strength and resources to the completion of our task both at home and abroad."

### Surrender Detailed

Supreme allied headquarters in a special communique said "allied expeditionary forces have been ordered to cease offensive operations, but will maintain their present position until the surrender becomes effective." It announced the Germans agreed to:

Order all resistance halted;  
Yield all ships and aircraft unscuttled and undamaged;

Ensure compliance with all further orders from the allied supreme commander, and the soviet high command.

The surrender document specified that nothing it contained limited or restricted any terms which might later be imposed on the reich.

"In the event of the German high command or any of the forces under their control failing to act in accordance with this act of surrender," it warned, "the supreme commander . . . and the soviet high command will take such punitive or other action as they deem appropriate."

"Thus was effected the uncompromising dictate of unconditional surrender laid down by Churchill and the late President Roosevelt at Casablanca."

### Suicide Attacks Continue

An unconfirmed Tokyo broadcast claimed a Japanese submarine sank "another carrier" near Okinawa. Adm. Nimitz announced Japanese suicide planes continued their attacks on U. S. shipping and powerful Third fleet units — unsuccessfully.

In the tenth army's latest Okinawa offensive, now three days old, the first marine division on the west smashed to outskirts of Dakeshi, a mile from their goal at Naha while the 7th army division widened a wedge on the east flank. The 7th was again forced to use scaling ladders as it burned its way with flame-throwers toward Shuri in the center.

man people and armed forces are, for better or worse, delivered in to the victors' hands.

"In this war which has lasted more than five years, both have achieved and suffered more than perhaps any other people in the world. In this hour, I can only express the hope that the victor will treat generously with them."

His face was expressionless and so were the faces of the American, British, Russian and French generals who represented the allies.

All had seen German murder camps and all knew the furious cruelty of German occupying forces.

The last straw in German resistance came when commanders could not get German soldiers to fight. It was disclosed by the German delegates who signed the instrument of surrender.

## War to Officially End Tonight, Doenitz States

LONDON, May 8 — (AP) — Grand Admiral Doenitz, Germany's current fuhrer, announced today that all German arms would be silent by 11 p. m. (2 n. m. PWT) tonight.

Hitler's successor as fuhrer of the German people said in an address over the German-controlled Flensburg radio that the Germans would lay down all their arms in accordance with the unconditional surrender terms he had ordered.

In slow, deliberate terms he told the Germans that the Nazi party had been severed from the German state and that "the party has left the scene of its activities."

"The German leader said that 'German soldiers of countless battles now are treading the bitter path to captivity and thereby are making the last sacrifice for the life of our women and children and for the future of our nation.'"

"With the occupation of Germany," Doenitz said, "the power has been transferred to the occupying authorities. It is up to them to confirm me in my function and the government I have appointed, or decide whether to appoint a different one. Impossible to Carry On

Doenitz explained why he ordered surrender.

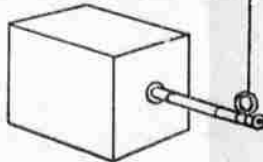
"When I took over from the fuhrer I took it as my first task to save the life of the German people."

"We bow before the sacrifices of our nation, of its fighting army, of all men, women and children," he said.

"It was impossible to carry on this struggle. A very difficult path lies before us."

"We must walk it dignified, disciplined and courageous. We must work hard."
