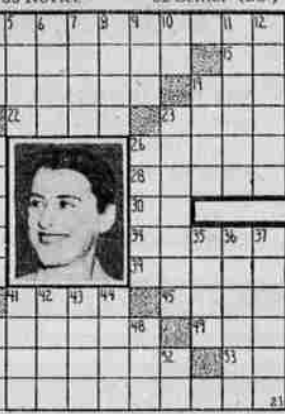
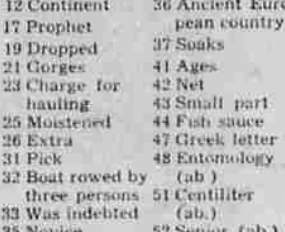

Lieut. Goodlow Buried Near Manila; Widow Gets Medal

Mrs. Lucia Britton Goodlow, serving with the women's reserve of the U. S. marine corps, reports receipt of word from the chaplain of the bombardment group with which her husband, Lieutenant William O. Goodlow, was serving at the time he was killed in action, that his body has been recovered and was buried at East Fernandez, San Juan, Manila. Lieutenant Goodlow, son of Mrs. Florence Goodlow, Roseburg, was killed Jan. 8, 1945, while on a bombing mission over Neilson field, P. I., his plane being shot down in flames.

His wife, a daughter of Mr. and Mrs. E. A. Britton, formerly of Roseburg, now of Corvallis, has received the Purple Heart awarded her husband posthumously. The medal was accompanied by a personal note from Secretary of War Henry L. Stimson in which he said, "The loss of a loved one is beyond man's repairing, and the medal is of slight value; not so, however, the message it carries. We are all comrades in arms in this battle for our country, and those who have gone are not, and never will be, forgotten by those of us who remain. I hope you will accept the medal in evidence of such remembrance."

U. of O. Men Talk Over Tax Issue at Conference Here

Earl M. Pallette, executive secretary of the University of Oregon, and Anne Cornell, athletic director, met in Roseburg Monday with the Douglas county chapter of the Oregon State Alumni association to discuss plans for the publicity campaign in connection with the \$10 million fund for construction of state buildings coming before voters of the state at the special election June 22.

The Roseburg committee is headed by Thomas C. Hartfel and includes Mrs. Lulu C. Gorrell, Paul S. Elliott, Mrs. George E. Houck, Verna Carruthers and Helen Saar.

Mr. Pallette explained the measure, which would authorize a property tax, which, in turn, would be offset by income tax surpluses. Of the \$10 million to be raised in two years, \$4 million would be used to improve facilities at the state's schools of higher education, and \$6 million would be used to improve state hospitals, penitentiary, training schools, etc.
