No Secret Pact at Yalta, Churchill Declares

LONDON, June 7. (AP)—Prime Minister Churchill told commons today that the Big Three made no secret agreements at Yalta that had not already been made public, but indicated that the discussions covered a wider field than the decisions officially announced.

"There were no secret engagements entered into at all" except the agreement to give Russia three votes at San Francisco, Churchill assured parliament. He then added significantly: "The conversations, of course, proceeded in a very intimate manner and I am not prepared to say that everything discussed at Yalta could be made the subject of a verbatim report."
