Beavers, Angelenos Divide Twin Bill

Seattle's Rainiers were half a notch closer to the first place Portland Beavers in the Pacific Coast Baseball league today, Oakland's hold on third was pared to half a game, and Sacramento had moved into the first division—but the big question was what had happened to the potentially dangerous San Diego Padres, beaten in 14 innings last night by the lowly Hollywood Stars.

The Padres, who a short time ago zoomed briefly to second place, lost their second straight to the tail-enders 3-2 to remain more firmly entrenched in seventh position.

Portland and Los Angeles split a twin bill, the Beavers hammering out a lopsided 15-2 win in the opener and dropping the extra-frame nightcap 2-1.

The Seals' 8-4 loss to Seattle dropped them out of the first division a half game behind the Solons.

Sacramento beat Oakland for the second consecutive night 11-1 to take over fourth place a half game beneath the Acorns.

Douglas Typical In Farm Survey

Douglas county, because it is so typical of the better agricultural sections in the country, was one of the 320 counties carefully chosen by Country Gentleman for a nationwide survey on post-war rural housing.

Personal interviews with over 2300 rural families in 44 states disclosed that 16.6 per cent of the farmers expect to build new homes, two-thirds having already set aside funds; 71.5 per cent expect to repair or improve houses at an average cost of \$399; 74.2 per cent expect to repair or improve farm structures at an average cost of \$525; 49.9 per cent expect to buy furniture and home furnishings at an average expenditure of \$255; 68 per cent expect to buy household appliances at an average expenditure of \$271 for this purpose.

Prospective builders will spend an average of \$3,500 for a farm house.
