Rescue of Crash Victims Essaved in New Guinea Jungle

HOLLANDIA, Dutch New Guinea, June 5.—(Delayed.) (AP)—A wartime air tragedy has unfolded in dramatic fashion the mysterious "hidden valley of Shangri-La."

Paratroopers—the first men from the outside world to invade the isolated home of six-foot, snow-wielding tribesmen—are building a older field in the valley, 150 miles southwest of Hollandia, to rescue a 30-year-old pilot and two air crewmen.

A dispatch, today, June 8, from Manila by Associated Press Correspondent Dean Scheidler, said the rescue still had not been effected but the survivors were "safe and living comfortably."

The trio are the only survivors among 24 army personnel in a transport plane which crashed into the four-by-25-mile, jungle-surrounded valley's Oranien mountain wall 24 days ago during a lightning trip.

Food and medical supplies are dropped to them. The natives, while slow to make friends, have not been hostile. After a gift of parachuted salt pleased the tribesmen, they even brought the survivors a pig to roast.

An odd funeral service, with Catholic and Protestant rites observed 11,000 feet above the wreckage in a circling aircraft, has been held for the dead. Twenty crosses and a star of David for a Jewish victim were dropped.

The surviving trio: Wac Col, Margaret Hastings, Oswego, N. Y.

Lt. John B. McCollom, Trenton, Mo. He is an air corps officer attached to FEASC.

Sgt. Kenneth W. Decker, Kelson, Wash. He is attached to the maintenance division of FEASC.

Decker was the most seriously injured. His deep back wounds were treated with boric acid dropped from a plane. McCollom suffered only a bruised head.

Bible School Joint Plan of Churches

The Presbyterian, Methodist and Christian churches of Roseburg will join in sponsoring a union Daily Vacation Bible school from June 11 to June 22, it was announced today. Mrs. Goldia Ferguson, Bible teacher in the Albany public schools, will superintend and has arrived in Roseburg to complete arrangements for opening the school Monday morning.

Instructions on Mailing Cans Overseas Issued

To use all the available space in the No. 2 tin cans for overseas mailing, Miss Doris McWhorter, war food assistant, suggests pouring the fudge directly into the tin can to harden. The tin cans are available at the county extension office in the post office building, Roseburg, for 5 cents a can. This amount includes the cost of the label, the can, and its freight charges.

Office hours in the post office building for sealing tin cans of food for shipment overseas are Saturday forenoon and Monday, all day.

Postal regulations permit the overseas mailing of tin cans properly tagged. The sealed tins must bear the sticker "U. S. Department of Agriculture label, signed by a representative of the U. S. D. A. then as a War Food Assistant or county agent to designate the contents of the sealed can. With the proper labeling, the tin can passes the censor without being opened or further examined. The tin can sealing service for Douglas County is being carried out through the county extension office in Roseburg under the supervision of Miss McWhorter.
