

# Olympians Blank Dunham's; Elks Down Sutherland

Two exciting softball contests were witnessed by fans Friday night, when Olympia Supply defeated Dunham's 1 to 0 in a brilliant pitching duel, and the Elks club won its first victory of the season, 6 to 4, at the expense of Sutherland.

The first game was marred by injury of Ayotte, Olympia Supply company pitcher, who was removed to Mercy hospital after cracking his ankle in two places and suffering a dislocation of the ankle when he slid into third base in the sixth inning.

Ayotte, who had been ably handling the pitching chore through five innings, was relieved by Peterson, who carried on successfully.

Better hitters lost. Dunham's outlasted the Olympians, 5 to 4, but failed to get a run across the plate. The lone run for the Olympians came in the fifth inning as the results of single and successive ground plays.

The Elks club chalked up its first victory in four starts by beating from behind to beat Sutherland, Walton, who had difficulty with his control while pitching for the lodgemen, was relieved in the fifth inning by Amos, a newcomer from Portland, who held Sutherland hitless and scoreless for the balance of the game.

# Davidson Downs Leone' in Torrid Three-Fall Bout

Buck Davidson scored another victory over Antone Leone's in their wrestling feud at the Roseburg armory last Saturday night, a battle that fulfilled expectations of means to the "ninth degree." It was a three-round session, preceded by one that did not get official recognition but which aroused the crowd to a high pitch of excitement.

As Buck was climbing through the ropes for the opening of the combat, the waiting Leone' kicked him back onto the floor, and, ironically, one of Davidson's feet struck and sounded the time-keeper's gong. Quickly doffing his robe, Buck clambered back onto the mat, pulled Leone's robe over the Frenchman's head and suffocated him sufficiently to score a fall that Referee Owen ruled would not count. This affair lasted just 20 seconds.

In the first "legitimate" round, lasting 1 minute and 20 seconds, Leone', with a crotch and head hold, dumped Buck over the ropes and onto the floor in front of the ringsiders. Buck returned to the

mat with an upraised stool, which Leone' managed to get possession of despite the intervention of the referee. With this impromptu weapon, Leone' "beamed" his tough opponent, putting him down and making him an easy victim for official fall No. 1.

Toeholds Decide Bout  
Round No. 2, which last five seconds short of 14 minutes, was an assortment of about everything but homicide, and at one juncture both combatants and the referee fought it out on the floor. After return to the mat, Buck subdued the Frenchman with a toehold. The same hold won the decision for Buck in the third stanza, after a series of shoulder butts and drop kicks. The time was 9:40.

In the preliminary bout, Milton Olson defeated Otis Clingman two falls out of three. Olson got the first fall with an Indian deathlock in 19:17, and the third and deciding one in 14 minutes with a body press following a quick spin out a Boston crab that looked like curtains for him. Clingman got the second fall in 11:38 with a body press following shoulder butts. In contrast to the main event, the bout was clean throughout and got a big hand from the spectators, numbering in excess of 500.
