Salvation Army Goal in Douglas Placed at \$4,000

County Judge D. N. Busenbark is announced as the chairman of the Salvation Army's 1945 annual maintenance appeal sponsoring committee, according to an announcement by Captain Alma Crotty, corps officer. Other sponsors include Roy O. Young, W. F. Harris, Dr. Clair K. Allen, Jack Fariss, Dr. G. C. Finlay, Paul Geddes, M. L. Hallmark, P. V. Harpham, Leone McLintock, Tom Parkinson, Dr. B. R. Shoemaker and Dr. E. J. Wainwright. The campaign commences Monday, June 25, and will be conducted mainly through the mails, a procedure which has received commendation from many business men during the stress of the war emergency.

At a recent advisory board meeting, a goal of \$4,000 was approved that it is hoped that this amount will be oversubscribed, because there is a need for the acquisition of permanent and suitable housing for the local work, commerce members report. According to Captain Crotty, the Salvation Army expects to assist in the rehabilitation of the returning service man and woman, just as it has helped in every other emergency facing the country. Many service people are already turning to the Salvation Army for counsel and help who have met representatives of the organization in war service on battle fronts throughout the world.

Liberal Response Expected
Major H. D. Goldthwaite, divisional secretary of the Oregon and Southern Idaho division of the Salvation Army, with headquarters in Portland, was in the city this week conferring with local officials regarding the campaign and declared that all were optimistic over a generous response to this year's appeal. The major announced that the army had recently opened another donut hut in Oregon at Huntington, where as many as one thousand service men are served daily with free sandwiches, doughnuts and coffee. Other huts are located at Pendleton and La Grande. While the war is making heavy demands upon the personnel of the Salvation Army, the organization's other activities are still being carried on, such as its group work among unchurched youth, care of unmarried mothers of Douglas county through its White Shield home and hospital in Portland, and the holding of spiritual meetings, where, according to Major Goldthwaite, efforts are made to bring people back into a right relationship with God.

The document also indicated, however, that the possibility of Spain's getting Gibraltar and French Morocco also was discussed.

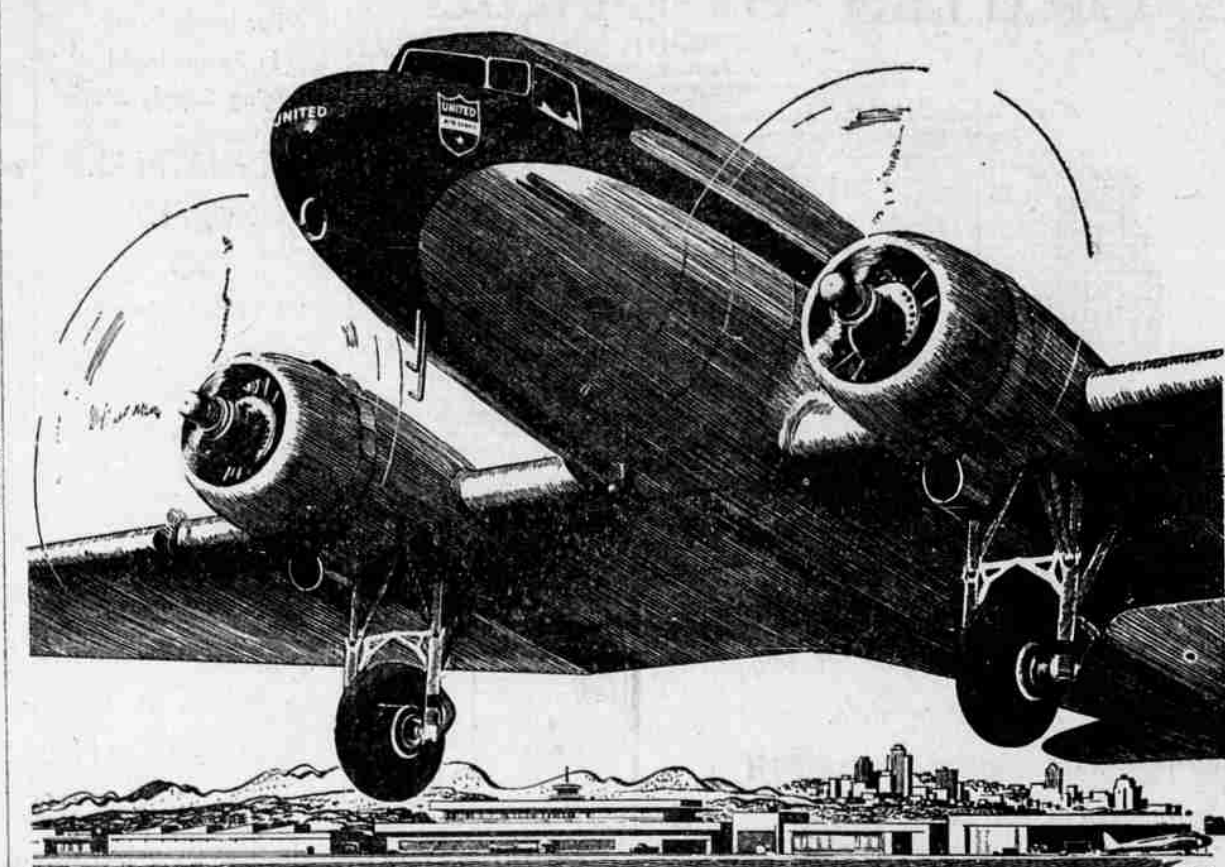
