Markets Defer Closing
Pending New U. S. Action

TACOMA, Wash., June 26. (AP) — Though Tacoma retail meat dealers pledged to forego all black market dealings—even if they have to close their shops—they agreed yesterday to postpone until July action on such closing to give newly appointed Secretary of Agriculture Clinton Anderson a chance to relieve the shortage situation.

I. W. Ringer, secretary of the Washington State Retail Grocers and Meat Dealers association, said that recent meetings had been held in the northwest with Anderson and plans had been

made to defeat the meat black market.

Ringer said he had sent telegrams to Anderson and Price Administrator Bowles acquainting them with the fact that many independent dealers in Seattle, Tacoma, Everett, Bremerton and other northwest cities were operating on a greatly curtailed basis.

Grateful Dutchman Gives Art Works to Portland

AMSTERDAM, June 26. (AP) — The city of Portland, Oregon, was good to a young Dutch lawyer in the early 1920's and today,

remembering that hospitality and grateful for America's part in the liberation of Holland, he has given three modern Dutch paintings to the Portland museum of art.

The lawyer, W. C. A. Van Everdingen, was admitted to the Oregon Bar in the early 1920's and spent what he describes as "ten extremely happy years" in Portland.

One painting is by F. Langeveld of the North Holland school at the turn of the century, and the other is a copy, on framed Dutch tile, of a street scene in the Hague, original by Klimtberg.

His third choice is a winter landscape by a Dutch impressionist, A. Colnot.
