PICNIC ENJOYED ON UMPQUA TUESDAY

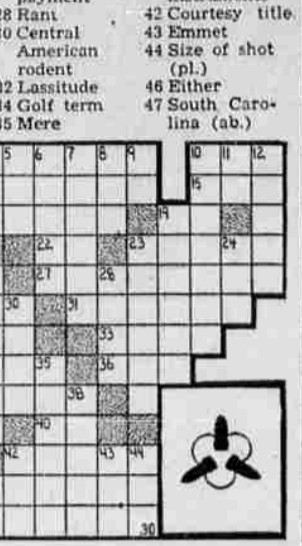

Judge Reluctant in Travel Wage Suit

PORTLAND, June 29—(AP)—A 30-day period in which attorneys can file briefs of argument has been granted in the test case now in federal district court to require payment of travel time for loggers. Judge McCulloch gave the order yesterday after two days' testimony, stating he was reluctant to make a decision because of its importance to public interest. The department of labor asks an injunction against Smith Wood Products company, Co. quille, accused of violating the fair wage standards act by failure to pay travel time. Testimony yesterday by defense witnesses asserted travel time was not discussed in company-union negotiations. The company argued that travel time is not recognized by the logging industry as working time. Judd Greenman, Vernonia, general manager of the Oregon American Lumber corporation, said an estimated \$80,000,000 in benches, tables and lights, fire-places and radio.
