Raps Charter But Pledges Support

WASHINGTON, July 3.—(AP)—In one of the first open senate breaks in the United Nations' charter, Senator Bushfield (R., S. D.) declared today the document contains at least six flaws. These should be corrected, he told his colleagues, before the charter is ratified.

Although the first-term westerner asserted some of the provisions must be changed "for our national safety," he announced he would support the treaty because he could not face his soldier son "if I fail to do what I can to stop the senseless, maniacal slaughter and planned murder of my fellow men."

Bushfield said all the objections "can be corrected easily by the senate," without harm to the treaty. An Associated Press poll already has shown more than the necessary two-thirds majority ready to vote for the charter. No senator interviewed has come out against it.

Oregon Juveniles Break From "Escape-Proof" Jail

OGDEN, Utah, July 3.—(AP)—Two Oregon juveniles escaped from juvenile detention quarters on the ninth floor of the city-county building housing Weber county's million dollar "escape-proof" jail, early today. Police said use of sheets tied together to form a ladder. The youths removed two metal cross bars and a portion of a vertical metal bar, slid down the sheets to the eighth floor and broke in the window in the office of the juvenile judge. They fled juvenile court of

fices, opened a window and jumped to the ground. One of the boys, believed to be Phil Weymer, 17, of Oregon City, Ore., was recaptured. The other boy, believed to be Robert Focen, 16, Empire City, Ore., escaped from the officers and was still at large late today.
