Husband of Slain Woman Tells Tale Of Double Attack

SEATTLE, July 5.—(AP)—The body of an attractive young woman, stabbed through the breast, was found under a railroad boxcar near the waterfront here early today.

Nearby, officers said, was a man whose draft card bore the name of Charles Ray Ross, Knoxville, Tenn., and who said the woman was his wife.

The officers said the man told a dazed, nearly incoherent story that four navy sailors had overpowered him as he walked along a downtown street with his wife, and then attacked her.

The young woman's body was in such a position that wheels of the boxcar would have severed it had the car been moved before she was found. Her dress was torn and disarranged. Nearby, the officers said, was a hunting knife and sheath and a woman's purse, presumably the victim's.

"They said Ross' clothing also was disheveled. He was de-

tained at police headquarters for questioning.
The officers said Ross told them he and his wife were on their way to catch a ferry to Bremerton when the attack occurred.

WASHINGTON, July 5.—(AP)—The senate passed and sent to the house the following bills:

June Weather Driest Month Since Year 1904

June weather was considerably warmer and drier than usual although it set no records, J. C. McCallister, meteorologist in charge of the Roseburg office of the U.

S. Weather Bureau, reports in checking the monthly summary. June, with 11 of an inch of precipitation, was the driest since 1904, although the record for June, 1938, was 12 of an inch. In 1904, records show only .33 of an inch of precipitation, while the all-time low on June rain-

fall was .01 of an inch in 1883. Highest temperature for the month was 96 degrees, June 18, and the lowest 42 degrees, June 14.
