"Insane Jealousy" Causes Husband To Kill His Wife

SEATTLE, July 6.—(AP)—Detective Capt. James Lawrence said Charles Ray Ross of Knoxville, Tenn., confessed he stabbed his 19-year-old bride to death here yesterday.

Lawrence said Ross gave a statement that he killed his bride, Wilma Margaret Ross, because of "insane jealousy."

Ross was questioned after the woman's body was found near a railroad boxcar near the waterfront today. He first said four navy sailors had overpowered him and attacked his bride. "It all came up over insane jealousy," Lawrence quoted Ross as saying. "I had caught her stepping out several times on me before, and I caught her stepping out last Wednesday night. I had been good to her and she had promised to quit it."

Lawrence added: "Ross said he had been talking it over with his wife Wednesday and said that the stabbing occurred after they had descended the stairs to the waterfront at the foot of Seneca street. He said he didn't remember but vaguely of the fatal blow and added: 'I sort of went out of my head.'"

Ross and his wife were civilian employees of the Puget Sound navy yard at Bremerton. Lawrence said Ross' parents were Mr. and Mrs. Robert O. Ross of Knoxville and that the young people were married there last February 27 after a two-day romance.

Oregon \$7 Million Short On E Bonds; 3 days to Go

PORTLAND, July 5.—(AP)—With only three days left to go, Oregon's E bond sales were still more than seven million dollars short of the \$35,000,000 goal today.

Sales are now \$47,583,447. On the all-over total, Oregon scored ahead to \$171,429,647—153 per cent of the quota.

Tornado in Nebraska Kills Six, Injures 12

RISING CITY, Neb., July 5.—(AP)—Six persons were killed and at least 12 critically injured by a tornado which swept a path five miles long and two wide north and west of here last night.

Three of the victims died in a hospital today and three were killed outright.
