

Beavers Maintain 4½-Game Lead of Coast Ball League

Portland's Beavers, whose steady pitching staff has been "money in the bank" all season, still lead the Pacific coast league by four and a half games today after cashing in last night on Helsner's 14th victory of the year.

Helsner registered his fourth straight triumph in beating the Hollywood Stars 12-4. Second-place Seattle kept pace with the Beavers by downing the San Francisco Seals 7-4.

The gap between second and third was widened to nine and a half games as Sacramento took a double trouncing at Los Angeles 5-4 and 6-5. San Diego's Padres humbled the Oakland A's 7-1 on Dummer's one-hitter, the best tossed contest of the night.

Portland went on another batting rampage in defeating the Stars, slamming out 15 safeties of which six were two-baggers. Long distance homers, however, went to Hollywood's second baseman, Richardson, who hit two consecutive homers, each time with the bases clear. The Beavers hold a 2-0 edge in the series. Seattle's veteran Fisher won his 13th of the year as the Rainiers evened the count with the Seals at one game each. After spotting San Francisco to a 4-0 lead in the first five innings, Fischer blanked them for the remainder of the tilt while his mates were pounding three pitchers for seven runs. Seattle started its scoring with a two-tally homer by Catcher Finley in the last of the fifth, added another counter in the sixth and clinched it with four more in the seventh.

Filbert Growers Urged To Spray or Dust Now

Filbert growers are warned to spray or dust immediately for the control of filbert worms. Filbert moths have begun to emerge and are laying eggs, according to B. G. Thompson, associate entomologist at OSC, in charge of investigation work at the experiment station.

Spraying or dusting should be done before the eggs hatch which is about eight days after the moths emerge. Lead arsenate, used at the rate of 3 pounds to 100 gallons of water, plus spreader or a 40 per cent lead arsenate dust is recommended. A thorough application of spray or dust, especially on the upper portion of the tree, is necessary for satisfactory control.

Growers planning to dust should use a 40 per cent lead arsenate dust applied at a rate of 40 pounds per acre. Dusting should be done in the morning hours when atmospheric conditions are calm.

ODT to Handle Farmers' Applications for Trucks

New and medium trucks are scheduled to come off the nation's truck assembly lines in increasing quantities in the coming months. So the ODT has simplified its procedure for allocating them. This should speed up truck rationing and the selling and transferring of vehicles by dealers. After July, ODT district managers will have full authority to allocate light and medium trucks and to issue certificates of transfer. At present, such requests are forwarded to Washington for approval.

Rubber Chief Urges Quick Use of Conquered Regions

WASHINGTON, July 18.—(AP)—The retiring director of the government's rubber programs today urged prompt military operations to liberate far eastern rubber-producing areas.

Citing a prospective shortage of natural rubber next year, John L. Collier, said "appropriate military authorities" should be told of the necessity of gaining new sources "in the very near future."

Once this has been accomplished, Collier said in a report, "this country should assist liberated territorial governments with supplies for gathering and preparing rubber for shipment."

Soldiers Barred From Cafes in Food Shortage

VANCOUVER, Wash., July 18.—(AP)—Soldiers and civilians at Vancouver barracks have been asked not to eat in downtown Vancouver in order to ease the food shortage.

The commanding officer said overnight passes will not be issued until after the evening meal is served.

Do you know this about Summer Desserts

Desserts for Summer should be light-textured, time-saving and eye-appealing. This delicious sponge-like cake with its colorful whip topping is one tempting example. And the delectable Fruit Pockets make for welcome variety.

FAIRY SPONGE CAKE

1 cup all-purpose flour	1 cup sugar
1 tsp. baking powder	1 tsp. vanilla
¼ tsp. salt	½ cup hot milk
2 eggs	1 tbsp. butter or margarine

Sift and measure flour; sift again with baking powder and salt. Beat eggs well with rotary beater; add sugar gradually and continue beating until mixture is very light. Add dry ingredients and stir until smooth. Add flavoring. Heat milk to boiling; add butter or margarine; stir quickly into batter. Pour immediately into 9-inch well-greased and floured cake pan and bake in moderate oven (350° F.) about 20 minutes or until done. Remove from pan; cool on rack. Serve topped with Fresh Fruit or Berry Whip. (Recipe follows.)

FRESH FRUIT WHIP

Soften 1 tablespoon unflavored gelatin in ¼ cup cold water, then dissolve in ¼ cup hot water. Combine ¼ cup sugar, 1½ cups crushed fruit or berries, ¼ tsp. salt, and 2 tbsps. lemon juice; add to gelatin. Chill until thick and syrupy; beat with rotary beater until foamy. Fold in stiffly beaten whites of 2 eggs. Chill until firm.

FRUIT POCKETS

Use your favorite biscuit dough recipe. Roll dough about ¼ inch thick; cut into six 4-inch squares. Place about ¼ cup sweetened fresh berries or sliced fruit in center of squares. Fold over diagonally; press edges together well with fork. Prick top to allow steam to escape. Bake in hot oven (450° F.) 15 minutes; reduce heat to moderately hot (400° F.) and continue baking 15 minutes longer or until done.
