Singapore Slated For British Blow: Evacuation of Civilians Indicates Japanese Are Expecting Major Assault.

By DeWITT MACKENZIE AP Foreign Affairs Analyst. For some three weeks Tokyo has been nervously forecasting a British attack on the island of Singapore.

It is true that the monsoon season, with its fierce winds and rains, is now in full blast over the Indian ocean.

Recapture of Singapore would be one of the big victories of the war, for it would permit the allies to reopen the narrow strait of Malacca between the Malay peninsula and Sumatra.

THE MILK CRISIS: The threat of dairymen to cease handling milk in the Roseburg area, except in limited quantities for children and to supply hospitals, is too serious to be passed lightly.

Interference with milk production and distribution has occasioned considerable difficulty since OPA first took over price control. An earlier state-wide battle, with producers and distributors aligned against OPA, resulted in minor price advances.

Due to the narrow margin of profit to the producer, which makes it impossible for them to hire help on the dairy, all the old producers, who have been supplying milk to this market, have discontinued operating their farms.

That the threat to discontinue service is not being made simply to force a better margin of profit is amply proven by the fact that three distributors, and all of the leading producers, have been forced out of business since the start of the war.

But because OPA would not provide a ceiling under which the dairy business could be continued efficiently, there has been a tremendous loss in production volume and a decided lowering of sanitary conditions.

Distributors offer as a solution a proposal to pay producers 95 instead of 85 cents per pound for butterfat and to raise the cost to consumers one and one-half cents per quart.

What solution will the OPA offer? If the usual course is followed, the OPA will first try a run-around until responsibility is definitely pegged.
