Longer Hospital Care Is
Faced by Ralph L. Russell

Ralph L. Russell, Equitable Sav-
ings and Loan company repre-
sentative in Roseburg, who was crit-
ically injured in an automobile
accident near Albany last July 8,
faces six more weeks in the Al-
bany General hospital, according
to word given his family Tuesday.

Although Mr. Russell's general
condition is improving satisfac-
torily and he is believed to be
out of danger, unless compli-
cations arise, he still is suffering
from concussion, and has verte-
brae injuries in the neck which
necessitate complete rest and
quiet for at least six weeks, his
physician reports.

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UMPUA FINANCE
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Wheeler Supports Charter But Raps Troop Use Phase

WASHINGTON, July 25.—(AP)—Senator Wheeler (D., Mont.) de-
clared yesterday he will vote for
ratification of the United Nations
charter as "a declaration of pious
intentions," but he promised a
"real fight" over limiting the use
of American troops.

The Montana senator, long a
bitter foe of American interven-
tion in European affairs, took
the Senate floor during the sec-
ond day of debate on the 50-nation
agreement after Democratic
Leader Barkley had asserted the
new league will succeed "if the
people of the world will that it
shall."

Wheeler criticized allied con-
trol of Germany, which he visited
earlier in the summer. He de-
clared that so far as the new
world organization is concerned,
it will have little voice in central
European affairs.

"By the provisions of this char-
ter," Wheeler said, "the people
of all eastern Europe are denied
the principles and the rights em-
bodied in the Atlantic charter.
And as between the victor powers
there is not a single international
convention, covenant or principle
in common among them to which
the people of eastern or central
Europe can appeal, or by which
any decision, agreement, or com-
promise among the Big Three
must be bound."

U. S. Rights Hazardous, Claim
Wheeler voiced a "grave fear"
that the charter "will even take
away from the people of America
the right to be heard on the
crucial issues of war and peace
in the future."

He will vote for it reluctantly,
Wheeler said, on the strength of
statements made to the Foreign
Relations committee by John
Foster Dulles, adviser to the
American delegation, that the
powers of the United States rep-
resentative on the Security coun-
cil will be spelled out in subse-
quent legislation.

Edward R. Stettinius, Jr.,
named by President Truman as
the American delegate to the
council, listened intently from a
gallery seat. Stettinius headed
the American delegation to San
Francisco.

Use of Troops at Issue
Wheeler said he could not sub-
scribe to the theory that the
President "now has, or ever has
had, the right to send American
forces anywhere, or for any rea-
son that he desired, without a
declaration of war by congress."

Examination of the record of
presidential use of troops with-
out prior congressional approval
he said, disclosed that the chief
executive claimed in each case
that he acted "to protect Amer-
ican lives and property and not
the property or lives of some
foreign nations or combinations
of nations."

"I stand upon that interpreta-
tion of the chief executive's
power," Wheeler declared, "and
shall oppose any other theory or
philosophy which tends to under-
mine in the slightest degree the
plain provisions of the constitu-
tion."
