"Dead-Eye" Shot By Myrtle Creek GI Saves Scouts

Ability for quick and accurate shooting saved the life of an American platoon sergeant and possibly other members of a scouting group which included Pfc. Ted Wallace of Myrtle Creek, according to an incident learned by Mr. and Mrs. T. A. Wallace, parents of the soldier.

Private Wallace was a member of a scouting group on Okinawa, entering a small clearing, they were sizing up the area over which they were to advance when Wallace spotted a Japanese sniper only 15 yards away drawing a bead on the platoon sergeant. Before the Japanese could fire, Wallace snapped a shot from his carbine and killed the sniper. Japanese money and a fountain pen found on the body while searching for important papers were sent home as souvenirs.

A member of the 381st Infantry, 96th division, Private Wallace served in the Leyte and Okinawa campaigns. He holds the Purple Heart for wounds suffered in action on Okinawa last April 24 and the Combat Infantryman badge. He entered the service October 27, 1943, and went overseas in July, 1944. His wife now resides in Eastern Oregon with her parents. Private Wallace graduated from Myrtle Creek High school with the class of 1940.
