He has been awarded the Silver Star and Purple Heart. Sgt. Leo Powell has been in service for six years and was stationed in the Canal Zone prior to going to the Pacific theater. He is now with the 41st Division. He also has been wounded. Sgt. Dorwin Powell recently reached New York with the 5th Armored Division and expects to be home on furlough in the near future and perhaps will be discharged, as he has 97 points to his credit. He wears the Bronze Star and Purple Heart.
