## New Weed Killer Not Yet Tried on Perennials

The new weed-killing chemical called 2, 4-D, now on the market under various trade names, will not qualify as an approved chemical under the AA practice for eradication of perennial noxious weeds, county AAA committee-men have been informed. Although this new weed killer is extremely effective with annuals, more tests are needed to determine whether it will permanently kill perennials such as Canada thistle, bindweed, white top and morning glory. Many experiments are in progress, and the results so far are promising.

Raymond L. Andrus, son of Mrs. Harry Rolfe, South Gate, Calif., and Pat Andrus, Roseburg, a former Roseburg resident, has been awarded the Oak Leaf cluster for his Bronze Star for heroic achievement with the 24th Infantry on Mindanao. Corporal Andrus, advancing behind a tank, came upon a cave from which

Japs were pouring machine gun fire on the advancing infantry. Andrus crawled through rocks to the mouth of the cave and hurled grenades into the Jap stronghold and killed the entire defending group. Corporal Andrus attended Roseburg high school and was employed at the J. C. Penney company store before entering military service. He is a nephew of Vern and Gene Shrum and of Lou Andrus, Roseburg. His mother is the former Elizabeth Shrum.
