Erick Erickson, Riddle Lumber Operator, Passes

Erick Mauritz Erickson, 57, of Riddle, died Sunday at Mercy hospital. He was born Oct. 12, 1887, in Sweden and came to the United States in 1907. He had been engaged in the lumber industry most of his life. Mr. Erickson and his son, Arthur, were owners and operators of the Erickson Shingle Co., of Marysville, Washington, and the Riddle Lumber and Manufacturing Co., of Riddle, Oregon, at the time of his death. He came to Riddle a year and a half ago to establish the business and make his home there. Mr. Erickson was a member of the Swedish Baptist church of Seattle, Wash.
He is survived by his wife, Martha, of Riddle; two sons: Arthur and David Erickson of Riddle; two grandchildren of Riddle; two sisters: Mrs. Victoria Olson of Seattle, Wash., and Miss Gundhild Erickson of Sweden; and two brothers: Carl and Fabian Erickson both of Sweden.
Funeral services will be held in the chapel of the Roseburg Funeral home at 2 P. M. Thursday, with interment in the Masonic cemetery.

Backward Fall of Horse Kills Girl Rider at Elkton

Theodore Evangeline McNeil, 21, resident of Elkton, died Saturday from injuries suffered while assisting her uncle, Clyde Vian, in gathering wood. Miss McNeil was riding a horse which was being used to drag large blocks of wood down a hillside to the family home. The horse reared suddenly and fell backwards, crushing the rider against the block of wood. She suffered a broken back and internal injuries, causing her death within a few moments.
Born at Eugene, March 15, 1924, she had made her home almost continuously with her grandmother, Mrs. Bessie McNeil, Elkton.

NEWS OF OUR MEN AND WOMEN IN UNIFORM

WITH THE 81ST INFANTRY DIVISION, Somewhere in the Pacific—Pte. Easton A. Dumont, son of Mrs. Pauline M. Dumont, of Glide, Oregon, has been awarded the Motor Vehicle Driver Badge for "excellent performance of duties as a driver of wheeled vehicles." Private Dumont is a member of Maj. Gen. Paul J. Mueller's 81st Infantry "Wildcat" division, which last fall wrested the Palau and other Western Caroline islands from the Japs.

Ens. Howard V. Applegate, 22, USNR, of Yonah, Ore., was aboard a converted T-CL (landing craft, infantry) during six battles when she stood off enemy beaches and tossed hundreds of rockets ashore in pre-invasion bombardments, beside destruction of land targets. The rocket boat's antiaircraft batteries shot down six Jap planes and fought off numerous other air attacks. At Okinawa she rounded up and captured Japs swimming to an escape. The other invasions were at Leyte, Lingayen and Nasugbu in the Philippines and Kerama Reto and Ie Shima in the Ryukyus.

McClellan O. Knapp, Rt. 2, Roseburg, Oregon, was commissioned as an Ensign, USNR, in graduation exercises last week at the U. S. Maritime Service Officers School, Alameda, California.

Maurice G. Holmes, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. T. F. Holmes, 809 Mill street, Roseburg, has been promoted to the grade of sergeant in the Women's Army corps. Sgt. Holmes is an instructor in radio mechanics and her promotion came exactly two years to the day from the date she taught her first class.

Mrs. Henry Teller, Roseburg, has received word that her son, Clifford W. Teller, has been transferred from Camp Mosey, Texas, to Camp Adair, Oregon.

Messages to POWs Being Collected Here
