TOWANSEND, Mont., Aug. 21—(AP)—Two carnival men were killed and a third injured seriously today when their south-bound automobile overturned on the highway near Toston, 20 miles south of here.

The victims were identified as James Burton Merrill, 42, of Cincinnati, Ohio, and Thomas P. Kinselle, about 40, of Richmond, Minn.

Robert Greening of Vancouver, Wash., suffered fractured ribs and shoulder blade, and possible spinal injury.

Coroner Rains said the driver apparently fell asleep. The trio had just left a carnival in Helena.
