He has had special studies in the Conservatory of Paris, France. He has served as director of music and organist in various churches in the Middle West and on the Pacific coast.

Mrs. Trued is a graduate of Luther college, Wahoo, Neb., and post graduate of University of Nebraska. She has had special studies with Frysinger and other masters and was prominent in musical circles in California prior to coming to Roseburg.

Mr. and Mrs. Trued, residents of Glendale, are musical directors at the Christian church in Roseburg.

Mr. and Mrs. R. L. (Bob) Stanleigh, formerly of Sonoma, Calif., who for five consecutive years spent their vacations on the Umpqua river prior to the war, are back again, this time to stay in Oregon if present plans materialize.

Mr. Stanleigh formerly published the Sonoma Index-Tribune, a weekly newspaper.

In 1937, accompanied by Mrs. Stanleigh, he came north seeking a good vacation spot. He was directed to the Umpqua river and each year, through 1941, returned

for a vacation of two weeks or more at Kentucky Homes. The war and gasoline rationing stopped the annual vacation trips. Mr. Stanleigh sold out all of his property interests and his newspapers and entered service with the Coast Guard, from which he was released on inactive status Aug. 19.

Out of uniform, he immediately headed for the Umpqua river and, through a stroke of sheer luck, found his cabin at Kentucky Homes available.

Mr. and Mrs. Stanleigh plan to spend several weeks on vacation, and will remain in Oregon according to present plans, hoping to purchase and publish a weekly newspaper.

Pre-School Meets For Teachers Set

Pre-school meetings for elementary teachers of Douglas county were announced today by Mrs. Lula C. Gorrell, county school superintendent. Conferences will be held at Dillard, Sept. 7, for teachers of the southern section of the county, and at Yoncalla, Sept. 8, for teachers in the northern section.

U. S. Generals, Free Of Nippon Prison Reach Chungking

CHUNGKING, Aug. 28.—(AP)—Lt. Gen. Jonathan M. Wainwright, 62-year-old hero of the American and Filipino stand at Corregidor, arrived in Chungking today with eight other U. S. generals and seven British generals released from a Japanese prison camp in Manchuria.

The names of the eight American generals accompanying Wainwright were not immediately made public.

The British generals were headed by Lt. Gen. Arthur Ernest Percival, former commander at Singapore. The party included Sir Shenton Thomas, former governor of Singapore; Sir Mark Young, former governor of Hong Kong; and C. D. Smith, former governor of North Borneo.

Gen. Wainwright had been found safe and well by a parachute team of Americans at a Japanese prison camp deep in

Manchuria earlier this month. In addition hundreds of other American prisoners of war, including Maj. Gen. George M. Parker, Jr., Portland, Ore., who served under Wainwright in the Philippines, were released. Wainwright was a prisoner of the Japanese for three years and three months. Corregidor fell May 6, 1942.

Gen. Wainwright took command in the Philippines in March, 1942, after Gen. MacArthur had been ordered to Australia to become supreme allied commander in the Southwest Pacific.

Wainwright was born at Walla, Wash. He was graduated from the United States military academy in 1906.
