Capt. Colin Kelly's Heroic Death in Battle Related

TOKYO, Aug. 30—(AP)—How Capt. Colin Kelly actually died in battle was related for the first time today by the surviving crewmen of his warplane. Their lips had been sealed for nearly four years by confinement in a Japanese prisoner-of-war camp.

America's famed ace, one of the war's first martyrs, didn't sink the Japanese battleship Haruna by piling his bomber against its stack—but he did a great hero just the same.

At the mention of his name, tears welled into the eyes of PFC Robert Altman, 26, of Sanford, La., just evacuated from the vile Omori camp in the suburban Tokyo area. The crew, he explained, idolized their captain.

"Captain Kelly made a run over the battleship, expecting to see a carrier nearby. Finding none was visible, he returned to attack the battleship, later identified as the Haruna. We dropped our three bombs in a train, scoring one direct and two indirect hits on the Haruna. The second bomb struck on the vessel's bridge."

"The first was a near miss aft, and the third a near miss forward, he continued. Both caused damage."

"The captain's skill was magnificent, to maneuver into position or to attack. Our navigator, Lt. Joseph Bean, observed a black wake and the vessel was burning from the bridge all the way back as we hit for our base at 20,000 feet altitude."

When the plane was five kilometers from Clark Field, Altman related, Kelly clapped to 10,000 feet. Then two Japanese fighters attacked and set the bomber afire immediately.

"Our plane blew up in less than one minute," Altman said. "Of our eight-man crew, Captain Kelly never cleared the ship and Staff Sgt. Delehanty, right side gunner, also was killed. I bailed out with five others and reached base unhurt."

Roseburg Yeomen Proud Of Service With Halsey

"We received the announcement this morning that the war is over. It is a quiet, beautiful day and is quite a contrast to that dark day back in December, 1941, when we on Admiral Halsey's flagship steamed quietly into a burning, wrecked Pearl Harbor." So writes Lewis Sutter, chief yeoman, serving with Admiral Halsey, to his parents, Mr. and Mrs. J. W. Sutter, Rt. 2, Roseburg.

"I was standing on the bridge this afternoon," Sutter relates, "when the admiral walked up and said: 'Well, Sutter, it took us almost four years but we did it, didn't we?'"

"In spite of the fact that the duty has sometimes been pretty rugged and the past few years have been long, I feel a deep sense of pride in having served throughout the war with such a man as Halsey," the Roseburg man declared.

Revised Casualties of U. S. Put at 1,070,545

WASHINGTON, Aug. 30—(AP)—Revisions and deletions in combat casualties reported by the armed forces today produced a reduction of 274 from last week's tally.

The new figure, which is not final, is 1,070,545 as against 1,070,819 for the preceding week. The current total includes 923,284 for the Army and 147,261 for the Navy.

Voluntary Action Of Press, Radio Banned Censorship

WASHINGTON, Aug. 30—(AP)—Byron Price said today that press and radio vigilance in observing wartime voluntary censorship was all that headed off a "surprisingly bitter dispute over free speech, with national unity the one sure casualty."

The director of censorship made this observation in an address to the United States Junior Chamber of Commerce and the National Association of Broadcasters, observing their 25th anniversary jointly.

"In this war censorship, to the disappointment of some, confined its operations to depriving the enemy of dangerous information and made no attempt to stifle opinion. In so far as war controls are concerned, press and radio are as free at this hour as they were four years ago today."

"Let me remind you that this result was not attained by accident or predestination. It was attained because editors and broadcasters were willing to cooperate loyally and effectively with their government in the one vital endeavor of restricting dangerous military information."

"If betrays no secret to say that if the experiment of voluntary compliance had failed, advocates of compulsion were ready to take the field without a moment's delay."

Price is liquidating the office of censorship, which he directed through the war.
