Enlistments in Navy Resumed

The U. S. Navy has been authorized to accept voluntary enlistments of men between the ages of 17 and 50 years for naval service. Walter F. Patrie, recruiter, reports. During the war period, men from 18 to 38 years, subject to selective service, could not be enlisted, but with end of the war recruiting has been reopened for peacetime service. Men 17 to 30 years will be enlisted in the regular Navy, while men in the older age group will be eligible for the Naval Reserve. Numerous inquiries concerning peacetime service are being received. Patrie reports, and full information now is available at recruiting stations.

Patrie will be in Roseburg in the near future and will be available for interview by interested persons, or information may be obtained from the recruiting station at Eugene.

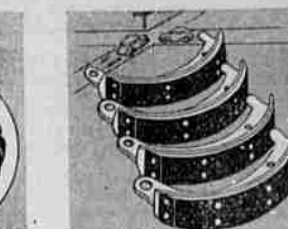

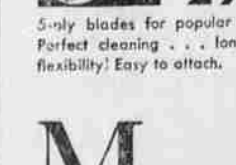

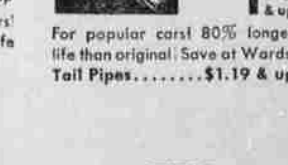
