NOTICE TO MILK CONSUMERS

IN ROSEBURG AREA

Effective Tuesday, Sept. 11, Retail Milk Prices
for Roseburg and Vicinity Will Be
15c PER QUART

Prices on Cream Skimmed Milk and Cultured
Buttermilk Will Be Raised In Proportion

This action is being taken because producers and distributors are no longer able to supply milk at existing prices. Application was made to the Office of Price Administration July 21, 1945, for an adjustment of prices in the Roseburg milkshed. Early action on the request was promised but to date, in spite of repeated notification of the urgency of the local situation, the OPA has announced no decision.

Producers and distributors no longer can afford losses, which are now being incurred daily, in producing and distributing milk at existing rates. We are, therefore, declaring new prices, effective Sept. 11, returns from the increase to be shared by producers, distributors and retailers. The Office of Price Administration has been notified of this action, which will remain effective subject to OPA ratification.

THIS ACTION IS BEING TAKEN TO AVOID CLOSURE OF PLANTS FOR PROCESSING AND DELIVERY PENDING OPA DECISION UPON APPLICATION FOR PRICE INCREASES.
