

Oregon REAs to Spend Millions for Expansion of Lines

Federal loan funds totalling \$3,041,812 are now available to 14 REA financed cooperatives in Oregon to build or expand rural power lines as rapidly as materials and labor can be obtained, according to a summary received from the head office of the REA by the O. S. C. extension service. The total includes \$2,052,312 which had been allotted up to May 1 as loans from authorized lending funds of previous years and \$988,500 allotted since that date from the fund authorized by congress for the current fiscal year.

This rural power line construction in Oregon is expected to add its share of employment for men released from war jobs and returned servicemen. The type of workers to be used will consist mostly of truck drivers, men to dig post holes and clear right of way, linemen and electricians to wire the premises of consumers, the REA leader reported.

REA Administrator Claude R. Wickard has urged the agency's 926 borrowers in 46 states to make special efforts to recruit the needed workers promptly so that the expansion program can proceed as rapidly as possible. Service Expansion Planned. A three-year postwar program by the Oregon cooperatives would provide electric service to an additional 13,300 rural consumers. If this is carried out fully, it will require expenditures of some

\$5,000,000 for construction of distribution lines and \$2,000,000 additional for improvement of existing electric systems, and the purchase by rural consumers of farm and home electric equipment. From past experience REA estimates that each new farm consumer will spend an average of \$145 for installing wiring systems in the home and on the farm. It also estimates that 35 per cent of the new farm consumers will spend an average of \$225 each for new plumbing installations. Thirteen of Oregon's borrowers have systems now in operation. These added to the large number of privately owned rural lines have put Oregon nearer the top of the list in percentage of rural electrified homes.

4-H Clubs Given Forest Tracts for Various Purposes

Four-H club groups throughout the state have acquired a considerable number of timber tracts which will serve throughout the years a duplicate purpose of providing educational opportunities and recreational facilities, reports Dan D. Robinson, extension for-

ester at Oregon State college. More than 500 4-H club boys and girls have attended forestry classes and field demonstrations at club summer schools and several county gatherings this summer, he said. The Oregon state board of forestry and several county courts have leased, sold or designated tracts of timber lands to county 4-H club leaders associations for use by clubs and other youth groups, Robinson explains. These areas are administered by the leaders associations which are responsible for their use and de-

velopment as outlined in advance agreements. In selecting such areas, primary consideration is given to a good water supply, suitability for tree planting sites and forest management demonstration projects. As they are used also for recreational purposes, adequate swimming facilities are usually arranged for. Buildings are added and improved as time and funds permit with much such improvement work contributed by parents and 4-H club leaders. In the postwar period some of these areas will be developed for

4-H summer camps, Robinson adds. Several such camps have been operated within the state in the past few years and have proved extremely popular. The tracts are also used for overnight camping sites and weekend hikes by various other youth organizations in the neighborhood.
