Army Recruiter Dated

Sgt. Browning of the Army recruiting office will be in Roseburg October 22 and 23 and will be available for anyone wishing an interview regarding enlistment in the regular Army. He may be contacted at the armory. Sgt. Browning has the latest information on the new volunteer recruitment act passed by Congress. Among other provisions, this act includes enlistment periods of 18 months, 24 months, and 3 years. Retirement on one-half pay or more after 20 years service. Promotion to private first class after six months service. Choice of theater and branch of service to men who enlist for three years. Provisions of G. I. Bill of Rights are made available to men enlisting prior to October 6, 1946. Dependents of men enlisting prior to July 1, 1946, may receive a monthly family allotment. Male citizens 17 to 34 years of age inclusive are eligible for original enlistment.

Russian Forces Start Manchuria Withdrawal

CHUNGKING, Oct. 17.—(AP)—Foreign Minister Wang Shih-Chieh said today the Chinese central government has been informed by Moscow that Soviet forces have begun a withdrawal from Manchuria which will be completed by the end of November.

Wang also announced that Chinese forces in northern Indo-China would be withdrawn "in the near future."

He said negotiations were in progress with the French on a number of Indo-China subjects, but he added he was not in a position to discuss them.

One Killed, 2 Injured In Oregon Trail Crash

PENDLETON, Ore., Oct. 17.—(AP)—Four motor vehicles, two trucks and two passenger cars figured in a collision on the Oregon Trail highway between Pendleton and Stanfield Tuesday night with Wesley George Strutt, 46, Portland, fatally injured, and Mrs. Della Wagner, La Grande, and Eldon Walker, discharged bluejacket from Cottage Grove, Ore., receiving minor injuries. Strutt's car collided with a parked truck and he was killed in the machine. Riding with him was Walker, Mrs. Wagner, in another car which collided with a third, received a broken wrist and face lacerations.

MEDFORD, Ore., Oct. 17.—(AP)—A government hunter has been ordered into the upper Applegate district near the California line to find a large cougar reported killing deer and menacing stock.

Russia, United States Sign Lend-Lease Pact

WASHINGTON, Oct. 17.—(AP)—Russia has signed a credit agreement with the United States for \$350,000,000 to \$400,000,000 worth of lend-lease goods whose delivery was halted on V-J day.

It was learned today that terms of the contract call for Russia to pay for the goods in 30 years at two and three-eighths per cent interest with the first payment beginning nine years hence.

It was learned that China is about to sign a contract at the same terms for \$64,000,000 in former lend-lease supplies.

British and American officials currently conferring in Washington are expected to reach an agreement on British lend-lease goods within the next two weeks. Britain was offered the 30-year two and three-eighths per cent arrangement several months ago but declined because of a dislike of the interest rate.

Deportation of Tule Lake Japs Immediately Urged

WASHINGTON, Oct. 17.—(AP)—Immediate deportation of Japanese aliens now being held at Tule Lake in California, has been demanded by Rep. Cannon (D-Mo.), chairman of the House Appropriations committee.

At hearings before the committee on rescission of surplus appropriations, made public today, Cannon insisted that the Justice department is taking "entirely too long" a time in deporting aliens.

"You ought to get rid of those at Tule Lake immediately," he said. Perry M. Oliver, director of administrative services for the department, said deportation of the Japanese would depend upon shipping arrangements to be worked out with the War department. He estimated the cost of deporting the Japanese at \$400 a person.

Underground Leader Of Danes Assassinated

COPENHAGEN, Oct. 17.—(AP)—Col. Riis Lassen, one of Denmark's underground leaders during the Nazi occupation, was shot to death last night on the brightly lighted main street of Aarhus. The assassin escaped.

The shooting was believed to have been instigated by the Homenen, a Danish-German or-

ganization of terrorists. Several days ago a terrorist leader who was arrested predicted an attempt on Lassen's life, and told police his men soon would begin a campaign of murder and terror in Aarhus.

Potato Harvesters Needed

CORVALLIS, Ore., Oct. 16.—(AP)—The state farm labor office issued another call for potato workers today.

The office said 50 job orders are coming in from Klamath farmers daily. The harvest probably will continue until early November.
