Bishop Hartman sent the first check yesterday to Roy A. Sullivan, city and telegraph editor of the Keene, N. H., Sentinel. He sent another check for \$30 today to A. L. Greene, associate editor of the Paterson, N. J., Evening News after receiving from Greene a front page containing a story accepting the bishop's challenge. Sullivan wrote the bishop that he would publish his article next week.

LONDON, Oct. 20.—(AP)—Norman Bailie Stewart, former Seaforth Highlander in the British army known as "the officer in the tower," was flown here from Brussels today to answer new charges of aiding Germany.

He was a predecessor of William Joyce, "Lord Haw Haw," who has been sentenced to death, for making broadcasts for the enemy.

Bailie-Stewart was identified in 1933 as the mysterious officer in London's tower, and was tried before a court martial on a charge of selling secret information to a German agent for \$250.

Ex-Soldier Dies in Noose

VANCOUVER, B. C., Oct. 20.—(AP)—William Hainen, 29, a former soldier, died on the gallows at Oakalla prison today for the murder of Olga Hawryluk, 23-year-old Vancouver waitress.
