The second in a series of music festivals was presented by the music department of the Methodist church of the evening of October 28. These music festivals are proving very popular with the church members and friends.

Guest musicians for the evening included a chorus of 40 girls from the Junior High school, who sang an unusual arrangement of "Beautiful Saviour" and the familiar "Old Refrain" by Fritz Kreisler. Mrs. Omar Monger directed the group.

Mrs. Thomas McNeill was featured as pianist in a piano-organ duet based on Bach's First Prelude. Mrs. McNeill is an accomplished musician and was graduated from the conservatory of music at Weimar, Germany. Mrs. Paul Geddes presided at the organ.

Outstanding among the choral numbers were: Bortniansky's arrangement of "Holy Father, We Adore Thee"; the strange and lovely Latvian folk song, "My God, and I" and the beloved "Goin' Home" from the New World symphony by Dvorak.

The climax of the evening was the concluding number, "The Living God" presented by Thomas McNeill, tenor soloist, and the choir. This unusually dramatic selection was especially appreciated by the audience. Mr. McNeill comes to Roseburg from Portland, where he was active in choir directing and solo work. He received most of his vocal training at Whitman college and from Madame Ina Wright Herbst.

A lovely soprano and baritone duet, "Hark, Hark My Soul" by Mrs. A. J. Ellison and H. D. Scott, and a fine male quartet completed the varied program. Plans are already being made by Mrs. Paul Geddes, organist-director, for future music festivals and the featuring of a string ensemble and other talent of interest to the community.
