Seventh Term Won
Bridgeport kept its socialist mayor, Jasper McLevy, elected for his seventh consecutive term. To offset the Democratic victory registered in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania Republicans re-elected two superior court judges, W. Heber Dittich and John C. Arnold, in statewide elections. Republicans won the mayoralty of Syracuse and Buffalo with Frank J. Costello and Bernard J. Dowd, respectively, but Democrats showed considerable strength in other upstate New York cities.

GOP Retains House Seats
In the 4th New Jersey district Republicans retained control of the seat resigned by D. Lane Powers. Frank A. Mathews, Jr., organization GOP candidate, ran well ahead in a three-man race. Frank S. Katzenbach, III, regular Democratic nominee, was second.

The 24th Illinois district also elected a Republican to Congress—Roy Clippinger—but he had no major opposition. Clippinger succeeds the late Rep. James D. Heidinger, Republican.
Mathews' victory in New Jersey made the House line-up: Democrats 241, Republicans 191, American Labor 1, Progressive 1, vacancy (in New Mexico).

In the only gubernatorial contest, Lieut. Gov. William M. Tuck was elected governor of Virginia by better than two to one over two opponents. He carried his ticket with him, including Lewis Preston Collins for lieutenant governor, and A. P. Staples, re-elected as attorney general.
Dewey's Decline Seen

Commenting on former Brig. Gen. O'Dwyer's victory over Dewey-backed Judge Jonah J. Goldstein, Republican-Liberal-Fusion, and Newbold Morris, "no deal" candidate supported by retiring Mayor La Guardia, Chairman Robert E. Hannegan of the Democratic national committee said in a statement:
"The landslide for General O'Dwyer and today's (Tuesday's) vote was truly a landslide—has a direct and important bearing on both the 1946 and 1948 election prospects.
"It not only attests to the growing strength of the Democratic party, but proves the popular will for a government pledged to carry on, under President Harry S. Truman, the policies and program of the late Franklin D. Roosevelt."
Paul E. Fitzpatrick, New York Democratic state chairman, said O'Dwyer's victory "marks the beginning of the end of Gov. Dewey's influence as a political figure in New York state."
