

Auto Industry, Unions Approaching Showdown

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Steel president, however, in a letter to Schwelienbach said existing ceiling prices "do not enable us to grant a wage increase at this time," and that negotiations would be useless until the price question is settled.

The automobile and steel disputes held the center of attention along the nation's labor front. Work stoppages across the country kept idle some 275,000 workers.

Capital Strike Ended

Street car and bus service in Washington, tied up for nearly two days because of a walkout of 4,000 AFL employees of the Capital Transit Co., was back to normal today as negotiations on wages got under way. The strikers returned to their jobs yesterday after a conciliation conference guaranteed no disciplinary action by the truck company. The union is asking for a 30 cents an hour wage increase.

Picketing at one of the two plants of Goodyear Tire & Rubber Co. in Akron, O., was reported ended and some of the 10,000 workers made idle by a work stoppage yesterday returned to their jobs. The stoppage occurred in a dispute between the company and the CIO United Rubber Workers over rescheduling of working hours for 1,600 maintenance workers and engineers.

Louisville Program Periled

Management officials said Louisville's multimillion-dollar reconstruction program faced stoppage because of two labor disputes keeping 800 workers from their jobs.

Operations of from 45 to 50 builders supply and construction firms were virtually halted when more than 250 AFL truck drivers struck in a wage dispute. A union business agent called the walkout unauthorized. If it is not settled promptly, management officials said, it will spread to every construction job in progress in Louisville and involve several thousand construction workers.

An arbitrator had awarded a 10-cents an hour wage increase. Management said it could not be paid without War Labor board approval but the union contended it could.

The other Louisville strike involved 500 CIO United Rubber Workers at the B. F. Goodrich company plant. Twenty-seven women members set up a picket line protesting layoffs despite high seniority, their attorney said, and the other union members refused to cross it.

The president of the Yale & Towne Manufacturing company, Stamford, Conn., was barred from entering his office because he had no pass from the AFL machinists to cross their picket line. The strike at the lock factory started yesterday when 2,700 union members demanded a closed shop and check-off, 30 new wage increases and "top seniority" for union representatives.

This picture was developed from talks with the highest leaders of both American and Japanese. The confidence expressed is perhaps more American than Japanese. Many Japanese view the future darkly. A few express the hope that American occupation will last many years, regarding it as a shield against further disaster.

Obedience So Far Complete

Americans and Japanese agree that thus far there has been 100 per cent compliance with the series of hard-hitting directives issued from MacArthur's headquarters. The initial occupation was completely bloodless; there have been no subsequent instances of revolt against American control. There is no evidence of any underground in the making. But, those who believe in a relatively short occupation emphasize that one which extends beyond five years will bring new dangers. Either the Japanese will become completely dependent on the Americans or resentment against alien rule will have time to flower into open rebellion.

Changes decreed by MacArthur have bestowed on the Japanese people freedoms they do not yet fully understand how to use, producing a state of flux from which vast changes in the Japanese way of life inevitably must come.

The nature of these changes obviously depend on the kind of control exercised by the victorious powers.

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witness continued, some Filipino women sneaked to the well and lowered ropes up which six men escaped. Some of the women liberators were captured and never seen again.

Another Filipino, Victor Manquil, said he was trussed up and marched off with 300 to another well. The one Umali had been in was filled with bodies by that time.

En route, Manquil dashed to freedom but was hit by two of seven bullets Japanese soldiers fired after him. He returned to the well a few days later and found the bodies of many men and women with whom he started the march.

Manquil said that none of the marchers was seen alive again.
