Sgt. J. E. McLaughlin Wins High War Honors

Staff Sergeant J. Elwood McLaughlin has returned to Roseburg after two and one-half years in service and is enjoying a 60-day furlough with his wife, the former Doris Lander, and their baby son. Since last January, S-Sgt. McLaughlin has been serving in India, flying with the

10th Air force. He was a radio-man-gunner on a B-24, flying bombing missions until the end of the war, after which he was radioman-navigator, flying supplies over the Hump into central China. S-Sgt. McLaughlin wears the good conduct medal, the air medal with oak leaf cluster, unit citation with cluster, allied ribbon, the CBI theater ribbon with three battle stars, the Burma star (British award), and the victory ribbon.

Following his furlough, S-Sgt. McLaughlin will report to Santa Ana, Calif., for discharge.
