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Wage Boost Agreed on By All Operators Here

All lumber operators in this district have agreed to the 15 cents-per-hour wage increase, was the statement yesterday from Oscar Slack, of the Roseburg Central Labor council. All operations in the lumber industry will be in full production by the end of the week.

The 15 cents-per-hour increase will make \$1.05 an hour low, the statement said, and 15 cents "straight across the board" to all other jobs.
